TEACHING ACTIVITIES

Presently Teaching

Graduate:

OT 506 Fieldwork and Integration (2 credits)

2019 - 2023

This course provides an opportunity for students to integrate and synthesize information from other courses to a participant in the community they work with throughout the semester. Students apply concepts of the Intentional Relationship Model with their participant to better prepare them for work with clients in subsequent semesters.

This course has an emphasis on leadership theories and models and OT leaders in the fieldwork. Students learn how to analyze their own leadership skills in regard to professional development and practice. I teach to both Casper and Grand Forks OT students (approximately 60 students). Course lead for 2021, 2022, and 2023

OT 542 Integration and Fieldwork 2

2020 - 2023

This course has a focus on integration to apply content in the semester. Topics include application of OT process with specific emphasis on professional reasoning in the evaluation process. Course lead 2022, 2023.

OT 543 Movement and Occupational Performance

2020 - 2023

This course emphasizes anatomy and physiology in relation to movement and how this impacts engagement in occupational performance. Students learn how to critically analyze movement and then apply it to function.

OT 601 Interventions for Neuromusculoskeletal & Movement Functions Related to Occupational Performance. 2020 - 2023

This course emphasizes intervention approaches for neuromuscular conditions across the lifespan; covering neonatal intensive care to geriatrics. Students are engaged in active learning through case studies and group work to demonstrate competency with intervention choices and rationale to prepare them for level II clinical fieldwork and beyond.

OT 603 Fieldwork Integration III

2020 - 2023

This course integrates intervention courses through case studies, simulations, and continued work on development of skilled note writing. Students attend a level I fieldwork experience and have assignments through this course that focuses on case study development.
