COLONEL (Retired) BRADLEY G. BUTZ

Colonel Bradley G. Butz retired as Chief, C2ISR Operations Division, Directorate of Operations, Headquarters Air Combat Command, Langley AFB, Virginia. Col. Butz is a 1985 Distinguished Military Graduate of the USAF Officer Training School at Lackland AFB -Medina Annex, Texas. He has served as an imagery analyst, fighter wing chief of intelligence operations, space/missile warning officer. intelligence/C2/space instructor, theater missile defense attack ops program manager, an air intelligence squadron Director of Operations. a Squadron Commander, deployed Commander, and Vice Commander of the 480th ISR Wing. His staff assignments include Headquarters, NORAD/USSPACECOM; Headquarters, Air Force; Headquarters, US European Command, as Chief of collection; and Headquarters, US Southern Command, as the commander of the Joint Intelligence Center South during the OPERATION WILLING SPIRIT, hostage rescue in Colombia. His career includes operational tours in Southwest Asia for USCENTCOM during operations ENDURING and IRAQI FREEDOM, RESOLUTE SUPPORT, INHERENT RESOLVE, and FREEDOMS SENTINEL. Prior to assuming his duties at ACC, he was deployed to RC-South, Kandahar Airfield, Afghanistan, supporting combat operations. Colonel Butz retired on 1 Feb 13 after 28 years of service, and continued deploying as a USAF contractor supporting unmanned air system ISR and strike operations. He is a C2, ISR and Space Operations expert, previously the Director of Strategic Operations and Business Development for L3Harris ComCept and Advanced Programs (Sensor Networking, Fusion, Analytics, Machine



Learning, Advanced Apertures and Beamformers, COCOM and Research Laboratory support), lead the Sector ABMS, JADC2, Space, and NATO efforts, and completed ten deployments supporting global combat operations. Colonel Butz is currently consulting and supporting data-driven decision-making for the Air, Space, C2 and Cyber portfolios. He is married to the former Kristina K. Eidal, and has 3 sons, Garrett, Brett, and Scott.
